AGREED ORDER WPC11-0066 GALLATIN PUBLIC UTILITIES SUMNER COUNTY, TENNESSEE

Dear Mr. Kellogg,

The Division thanks you for meeting with us on August 1. As we discussed, the Division recognizes the remarkable work, and future planning, demonstrated by the City, before and after the Agreed Order. We have found that all requirements in the Order have been met and the case has been closed.

We also discussed the City's plans to initiate a self-imposed moratorium on new connections within the basins of the collection system served by the Number 1, and Bulls Creek, Pump Stations. NPDES permit TN0020141 requires the City to conduct a self-imposed moratorium when greater than 5 overflow events occur at a single location within a year. According to our records the City has met the threshold to initiate a self-imposed moratorium in those two basins. It is anticipated that the City's current projects, and near-future projects, will alleviate overflows

in those areas. Please continue to remain in close contact with Compliance and Enforcement by sending written notification when the Bulls Creek project is complete.
